

McMaster University Articulation Agreement

At the time of admission to McMaster University, graduates of the two-year Sheridan College General Arts and Science two-year diploma program who achieve a cumulative average of 75% (cGPA 3.3) or greater will be eligible for advanced standing toward their B.A. Honours program in the Faculty of Social Sciences. A maximum of 48 units of transfer credit (42 units of Level 1 credit, and 6 units of Level 2 credit) will be granted to students who meet these conditions at the time of admission. Credit will be assigned as specific equivalencies and unassigned credit, as appropriate, with additional units provided in block credit (to a maximum of 42 units in Level 1).

Specific transfer credit will be granted for only those courses with a grade greater than C-. Direct entry to level 2 of select programs is available to eligible applicants, subject to meeting additional course and grade requirements, as outlined by the program.

In each case, students must first have completed the required General and Science courses for these programs and have achieved a grade of 70% or greater in these required courses.

Currently, identified pathways for direct entry into Level 2 programs include:

- Aging and Society,
- Anthropology
- Society Culture and Religion
- Sociology
